
Make the most of the space


How are kitchen doors made?

Kitchen doors are made from numerous materials and construction methods, as shown below. All doors are manufactured to a high level, so go with the door finish that is right for you, not just based on the price. Some doors cost less to produce due to their popularity.

Standard corner units in kitchens can be bottomless pits that would take even a contortionist a while to slide in there, and find what they were looking for! When planning your new kitchen, don't forget that there are many different corner unit solutions available to make life easier.

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Built under ovens

Many modern kitchens now contain built under ovens or microwaves. This allows the ovens to fit in with the design of the kitchen and slot inside a pre made appliance housing.



Appliance housing unit

Most people install a standard built under oven housing as they are not fully aware of the types of units available. The examples below show how to better utilise the wasted space below the oven.



Lots of free worktop space?

You may find that your kitchen has a long run of units and you have more workspace than you know what to do with. If tall units don't fit into the design of your kitchen then you can opt for dresser units instead.



Create a kitchen feature

Dresser units are mounted neatly onto your worktops and give you additional storage, as well as nice little features for your kitchen that can also be used to showcase items of cutlery or ornaments.



Bottle storage

Storing bottles in the kitchen can take up a fair bit of unit space and much of that space can go to waste if the bottles aren't stored correctly and ultimately safely!

If you want to store your wine bottles in purpose built units then we have 5 options for you to choose from. Ranging from standard kitchen units to thin bottle racks.




Plan your wall units

Decisions decisions

Every kitchen needs a way of removing cooking smells and warm air but there are many different ways that you can do this. The main decision that you need to make though is how you want the cooker hood to look within your kitchen.



Think ventilation

As well as aesthetics, there are two ways in which food smells and air are dealt with by the extractor. One is via an air ducting kit to an outside vent and the other way is via air recirculation to clean the air through carbon filters.



Take time and plan

One of the most common types of wall units that you will see in a kitchen are the single and double wall units but a little planning & knowledge will open your mind to all the options available!

Make a note of the following before you plan your kitchen: Distance between walls, room shape and overall

- Mark the location of radiators, pipes, gas, electricity and
